7. Budget Items

Laura O'Hara: Gro-Turf Quote – turn maintenance to school oval and early childhood area only for a 12-month period. \$17,820. Whole school \$34,000. Stick with the department's lawn moving service, broadleaf spray only, once per year.

Agreed to at the meeting:

Remain with the government contract. P&C to allocate funds to maintain the oval in the condition as it is now (good condition). \$10,000 for an external company to maintain on an ad-hoc basis. Lawn doctor to do annual broadleaf weed, approx. \$500. Investigate another contractor.

Laura O'Hara: Cubby for ECE first choice \$11,788.15, second choice \$7,150 (cubby and car inc.)

Laura O'Hara: New Sports Equipment \$5,006.00

Hayley Sforcina: Treatment and Prevention of Bore Water Stains \$4,700. School/department to fund.

Rachel McMahon: \$15,000, (grant has been applied for \$25,000), 9 reverse cycle airconditioning units required, first looking at admin row and year 1 rooms.

Nicole Stevens: Replacement upright fridge for the canteen \$800

Nadia Bowey: Replacing the benches (near the nature play) \$5,000

Nadia Bowey: Replace the glass case portion of the outdoor sign (near the drop and wave gate entry) with an Acknowledgement of Country plaque. Price range from \$199-499, or, Woodlands P&C look to order a custom made Acknowledgement to Country plaque. Price range between \$250-\$650.

Nadia Bowey: Finish elements of the Nature Play Space – note, only applicable if the grant isn't approved. If the grant isn't approved, a proposal of \$5,000 to complete the nature play space (creek infill based on existing concepts).

Agreed top four items:

- 1. Turf / landscaping and maintenance, suggestion to include native plans/trees around the school \$5,000 (school to match the amount)
- 2. Benches \$5,000
- 3. Sports Equipment \$3,000 (split)
- 4. Air Conditioning \$15,000

Agreed items, should enough fundraising profits raised in 2023 allow:

- 5. Cubby House up to \$10,000
- 6. Sports Equipment \$2,000.00
- 7. Nature Play finish the elements of the initial design (snake head) \$5,000
- 8. Acknowledgement of Country plaque to be included on the current school sign (near the kiss and drop gate) \$800

3. Parent Feedback on School Communications

Woodlands Primary School communication platforms include the school website, (which comprises and overview of the school, policies, curriculum, programs, staff, forms, school plans, booklists, charges, history, and links to Compass, uniform shop, parent handbook, canteen and OSH Club), and Compass.

The school uses the Compass platform to monitor student attendance (and provide parent notifications if students are not at school and parents have not notified us about the absence), collect payments for excursions and events, provide a school calendar of events, and send notifications from the principal, classroom teachers, P&C, Uniform Shop and Community organisations, ie sporting clubs.

SUBMISSION TO THE P&C

I've had feedback from parents that there are too many notifications coming through Compass. This feedback has come through the 2022 National School Opinion Survey as well as in person. I appreciate this feedback.

The school is reviewing its use of Compass to see if the frequency and volume of notifications can be better coordinated and/or reduced.

The school is considering sending notifications only to the Compass app and discontinue sending emails. That way, parents will go to one place, the app, to get all school notifications. This will address parent concerns that school emails get lost in personal emails. We are open to suggestions on other ways to improve school communications, so let me know your thoughts.

Woodlands Primary School P and C Treasurers Report As of 18/3/2023

\$27,213.70 in general account

\$41,289.85 in the online saver. This correlates to the running and budgeted costs of the P and C for one year.

We have around \$1500 in outstanding monthly bills and wages to be paid shortly and around \$1000.00 of banked but not cleared cash. There is also another \$600 of unallocated money that we think is a bank error that is showing as a deposit to the account. We are investigating where this has come from.

The canteen is running at a slight profit of \$132.01, though as previously said, there are outstanding bills and wages not yet through on the account, so I would estimate that it is running at a \$600.00 loss if we were taking these into consideration.

The uniform shop is showing a profit of \$2,311.31, stock has decreased slightly to \$22,964.00 but still a lot of money in inventory being stored.

From this, I can safely say that we have \$25,000 but no more than \$30,000 available for budget items right now. This is money that we did not commit/over fundraised last year. As we have not had any fundraising this year, this amount comes mainly from the figures last year.

In addition to this amount, we could allot an amount that we could potentially make via fundraising. I would suggest this would be \$15,000 to \$20,000 on past history.

It should be noted that this list should be prioritised and not purchased but stay pending until we have secured the amount for the items.

Woodlands Primary School P & C Communications and Social Media Guidelines

Communications Role- Responsibilities

- Posting on the school Facebook page, including news, questions and other material to the page.
- Liaise with the P and C, via the Vice President to prioritise posts.
- Be responsible for newsletters (i.e. top 5 updates) and other communications.
- Reporting back at general meetings any enquiries, queries or matters raised on the page.
- Account administration

Facebook Operation

The Communications Person will have full administrator rights to the Facebook group as well as the personal profile Woodlands Primary PC.

A minimum of one and up to three people can be administrators of the Facebook account.

Administrator duties to include:

- Deletion of comments that breach the Code of Conduct
- Removal and/or banning of any user who breaches the Code of Conduct continuously
- Respond to queries raised through the account or refer these to a relevant person for response
- To liaise with the communications person on further duties

Positions to be voted in at a general meeting

Social Media Policy and Responsibilities

The communications (and administrators) must follow the following when posting.

- Accept members who have filled in the questions, even if you know them, it could be a fake copied profile.
- No identifying information or photos of students or school staff will be/can be uploaded to the accounts without explicit permission.
- Act on behalf of the P and C with P and C news and events only, unless expressly asked by the P and C.
- Be considerate on frequency of posts, generally no more than three per week.
- Be professional, respectful and polite.
- Listen and respond to feedback professionally
- Do not answer questions if outside your knowledge. Seek guidance
- Never share sensitive or confidential information

Woodlands Primary P and C Facebook Code of Conduct Purpose

Our Facebook group allows our school community to stay up to date with P and C activities, events and information through a medium preferred by an increasing number of people. This Facebook group is operated on volunteer power by the school P & C. Accessing and commenting on this Facebook group indicates you have read, understood and accepted our Facebook Group guidelines set out below.

Facebook Guidelines

All users of a Facebook page representing a Parents and Citizens' Association must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Comments and responses to the page must be related to the P&C, the school community or in reply to a post left by the administrator on behalf of the P&C.
- Users are not able to author a post of their own or load media such as video or photos.
- All discussion must remain professional and personal topics are not to be discussed.
- Defamatory or derogatory comments are not permitted.
- Swearing, obscene and abusive language is not permitted.
- Rude or obscene photographs, or links to photographs, are not to be posted on the page.
- All advertisements posted on the page should be in relation to the P&C.
- Derogatory, defamatory, confrontational or incorrect information relating to a P&C committee's employee or administrative position should not be discussed on the page.
- Information related to the financial position, direction or account details of the P&C should not be discussed on the page as it is in the public arena.
- Personal information related to specific individuals of the P&C, of which that individual does not want released, should not be discussed on the page.
